In recent years the Society has also gained recognition as a citing body for ACCEA and we have also been able to support individuals in their applications for the current round.

Following on from the very successful attendance at the BDA conference in the spring of last year, the recently formed Early Careers Group (led by Kushal Ghadia) organised a training/study day for those attempting assessments within the specialty – those giving up their time to assist our trainees included Peter Briggs, Roger Yates, Richard Porter, Wendy Taylor, Tim Friel, Arijit Ray-Chaudhuri, Sara Tabiat-Pour, Alex Mustard, Gerry McKenna,



Ahmed Farooq and Phil Taylor – the long list gives testament to the commitment and engagement and that we as a Society benefit from; my thanks once again go to all involved.

The webinar series continues, with Dr. Gareth Brock doing a sterling job of hosting we have some excellent speakers who have kindly agreed to cover a range of topics and I encourage all those who have vet to do so to engage with these, either during the live presentation or accessing thereafter via the website: it is a fantastic resource. We also now have discussion fora to allow follow up debate. 

Reflections of a Prosthodontic Trainee

Immediately after my vocational training year, the idea of full-time self-funded postgraduate specialization seemed impossible and as a result, the idea of choosing this single career pathway out of the many available to young newly qualified dentists made it an easy option to ignore. No income, increasing debts, long hours and late nights are just a few of the excuses many use to deter themselves from taking on postgraduate specialization.

To some extent these concerns are real, especially from a financial standpoint. However for those who are fortunate enough to be able to fund the course, I would suggest they seriously consider Prosthodontic mono-specialization at Bart's School of Medicine and Dentistry.

Three years of full time postgraduate studies is daunting for even the keenest young dentists in the UK. The first twelve months of the course proved to be the most intense. The jump from 9-5 working hours to full time postgraduate studies was initially difficult to get used to. Outside of the dental hospital the majority of my 'free time' was spent reading countless journals and textbook chapters attempting to cover all the reading lists given to us by our tutors. I would miss out on countless events with my friends and family in an effort to ensure I had read and understood every journal we were asked to read. Fortunately QMUL library holds numerous paper and online subscriptions to dental journals, which made literature searches much easier to complete.

During the first year we also became familiar with The London Deanery's expectations of us. Reflection, feedback, observed clinical procedures, audits, teaching and patient case logs are additional tasks one has to

complete during the course. Whilst they are all fairly easy to complete, communication from the deanery was lacking which made understanding what was expected of us more challenging. Support from our course lead made these tasks easier to manage.

The second year flew by. More active clinical time and less book learning meant that I was able to put into practice all the knowledge I had gathered over the previous year. The research dissertation module was a challenging part of this year. I was fortunate enough to have an excellent supervisor who was supportive and encouraging and I was able to pass with merit and was awarded a prize for my poster presentation on the project at the annual BSSPD conference in 2015. During the second year we moved to the new dental hospital building which was a breath of fresh air. The move was seamless and the new environment and equipment made clinical time during the second half of the course more enjoyable and less stressful.

The final year of the course was challenging to say the least. Some uncertainty about the format of our exams and where they would be held was somewhat distracting however the support we had from our course director was invaluable and thankfully I was able to pass the examinations at the first attempt. The final six months of the course was once again filled with copious amounts of reading and revising. It became clear to me that if I were to become a specialist that it was up to me to ensure I had the knowledge and skills to back up that title. The facilities and staff at Bart's SMD made this pursuit much easier to manage in that the working environment is calm, relaxed and conducive to carrying out clinical work of the highest level.

William Ronald Edwards Laird

1939-2015

William Ronald Edwards Laird qualified from the University of Glasgow in 1962. Following dental practice in London, Ronnie returned to Glasgow to become Lecturer in Pharmacology and then Dental Prosthetics. It was here that he met Kay his wife who worked as a staff nurse in the Oral Surgery Department. In 1970 he undertook research at the Eastman, London in physiological jaw

movements and in 1974 worked at Manchester Dental School as Senior Lecturer in Prosthetics.

Ronnie was appointed Professor of Dental Prosthetics and Head of Department at the University of Birmingham from 1984 until his retirement in 2004. He was Director and Head of the School of Dentistry from 1989 to 94. There was turmoil and change at the University and Ronnie was asked by the Vice Chancellor Professor Sir Michael Thompson to

undertake changes in Dentistry. Ronnie kept the ship afloat and Birmingham emerged a much stronger school.

Appointed as Public Orator for the University at Degree Ceremonies, Ronnie introduced well known honorary graduands prior to the award of their degree. His introductory speech for each of the awardees was meticulous in preparation.

Externally he served as Chair of the Council of Deans of Dental Schools (1993-95), President of the British Society of Prosthetic Dentistry (1996) and both member and

Chair of various GDC committees, including the Finance Committee and Professional Conduct Committee (1989-2003). He was a champion of the education and training of Dental Nurse Assistants and was a member of their national examining board.

Ronnie was a super clinician on removable prosthodontics and did attract his fair share of difficult cases which he handled

professionally and always put the interests of the patient first. He loved teaching dental students and a Facebook page set up as a memorial received over a hundred likes and many more comments. All attested to his fairness and expertise as a teacher in prosthetics.

Outside dentistry he had an encyclopaedic knowledge of Scottish Football, and followed Queens Park where he sponsored the match ball at home games. He loved his cars including Rovers and Jaguars. In his latter years he spent time in

Millport an island off the Scottish coast which was his "island of dreams". Ronnie loved people, he loved conversations and he was in the true sense of the word, a raconteur. Never stuck for a story, an anecdote or a joke. At work gatherings or family events, he was often called to give the speech of thanks, he had a great gift in this area of capturing the moment in a few words.

He will be sorely missed by by Kay, Simon and Sally, the wider family and his grand-daughters, Poppy and Charlotte.

It is with immense sadness we inform you that Graham Gilmour passed away on Friday 8th January.

Graham was born in Burns Country in the West of Scotland on Good Friday in 1955. He was appointed as the first Consultant in Restorative Dentistry at Mayday University Hospital in 1987 at the age of 32. He worked energetically and enthusiastically to establish and grow Restorative Dentistry locally and even extended his influence across the South of England, holding peripatetic Consultant posts in Bournemouth, Southampton, Winchester and Basingstoke. His clinical interests included the diagnosis and management of tooth surface loss, adhesive dentistry and prosthodontics. His particular talent was in diagnosis. Professionally, he quickly established himself as a leading Consultant at the Mayday and he also met the love of his life there.

Graham was immensely proud of his service, helping local patients as well as influencing the lives and careers of all those he came into contact with. He was, throughout his career, a dedicated teacher with a strong commitment to both

undergraduate and postgraduate dental education. He lectured widely at home and abroad, always receiving excellent feedback because of his naturally humorous and captivating style. A larger than life character, it will not surprise you to know that the concept of combining work with pleasure was first thought of by Graham early on in his career, when he organised educational dental cruises. In 2003 he was appointed Associate Dean of Postgraduate Dental Education for Kent, Surrey & Sussex and has more recently and for many years made a significant contribution to undergraduate dental training.

Everyone who knew Graham will remember him, his infamous Burns Suppers, his love of Tony Blackburn and his desire to throw a party at any opportunity and be the star attraction as the DJ!

The loves of his life are Virginia and their two daughters Ginny(15) and Ally (10). He will be greatly missed by them, his brother, his friends, colleagues and everyone who came into contact with him.
